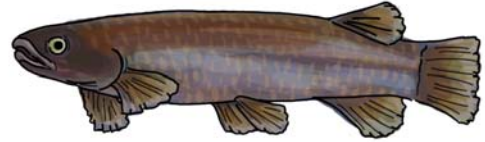


Sustainable Fisheries and Native Freshwater Fish Workshop

Who: Everyone interested in native freshwater fish and fishing for the future.

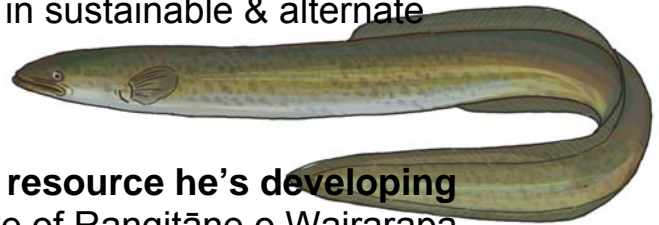
Why: Come along and learn about New Zealand's unique freshwater fish and how to fish sustainably.
